Allison Simpson (2B, CF, RF) \$2,100,000/3 years (year 3 of the rookie salary cap)

Having avoided the sophomore slump that hits most players in their second year, Ali posted strong numbers in all offensive categories last year, proving to all that Caelly's not the only talented Simpson ballplayer. She added to the legacy that is the Stars of Destiny when she teamed up with her sister Caelly to run the bases in her panties late in the season. Good times.
